Centenary College of Louisiana partners with Washington University in St. Louis to make engineering education accessible to liberal arts students. Created in 1973, the Engineering Dual Degree Program fosters a community of well-rounded engineers who are uniquely positioned to bring both breadth of skill and depth of knowledge to solving problems and improving lives.

- During your three years at Centenary College, develop valuable foundations in academic, communication and social skills.
- During your three years at Washington University, gain analytical acumen, technical knowledge, and engineering insight.
- At both institutions, benefit from career services, experiential learning, peer support, faculty advising, alumni networks, and more!

Clear criteria lead to predictable Engineering Dual Degree admission.

- With advisory help from Centenary, include pre-engineering requirements in Centenary coursework.
- Achieve a 3.25 cumulative GPA and a 3.25 STEM GPA in at least 90 Centenary credit hours.
- In year 3 at Centenary, submit a free application to WashU to verify the qualifications above.

Engineering Dual Degree students build diverse credentials during six college years.

- Transfer Centenary credits to WashU and, later, transfer WashU credits to Centenary.
- Within the first two years at WashU, earn undergraduate degrees from Centenary and WashU.
- After a third year at WashU, also complete an engineering master's degree from WashU.

All Engineering Dual Degree students receive a three-year scholarship at WashU.

- The Graduate Affiliation Scholarship is automatically awarded to all admitted students.
- The Graduate Affiliation Scholarship provides a 50% tuition discount for six semesters of study.
- Students may submit a separate application to be considered for an additional (merit) scholarship.

Attending Centenary College opens a door and defines a pathway to engineering education at WashU.
